## Wayfinding

'Fingerboard' signs, pavement stickers and other treatments suitable for a walking speed can encourage pedestrians to use designated (i.e. treated) routes and to provide route confirmation.



Advantages	Disadvantages
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Inform pedestrians of preferred routes - for safety, directness etc.</li> <li>• Can be used to create a greater sense of continuity and coherence for a given route</li> <li>• Can be used to shift desire lines (i.e. preferred routes) to safer paths</li> <li>• Increases the visibility of routes</li> <li>• May improve parents' perception of safety</li> <li>• Easy to install and low cost</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• May not influence pedestrian behaviour</li> </ul>
